There were 15 actors in this show, many taking on several parts. The original script called for 22 characters. We made 27 costumes, numerous and sometimes ingenious props and performed to sellout audiences every night on a tiny stage.

I am grateful too, to the backstage crew building the set, lighting, sound, prompt, props, publicity, programmes, dressers and FOH. You all did a marvellous job.

### 2019

### December 2nd to 7th - Phil Mansell will direct his play Look Out - He's Got a Gun!

### 2020

Spring - Caroline Drewett - Mansell will direct **Dead Guilty** by Richard Harris at Gata. A tense psychological study of guilt and obsession.

This is a powerful revenge thriller that will hook you in the first few lines, grab your attention while the intriguing storyline develops, and hold you spellbound until the final shocking scene.

*Dead Guilty* concerns a graphic artist whose leg is badly injured in a car crash that occurred when a business associate suffered a fatal heart attack at the wheel. Housebound and depressed, Julia is tormented when things disappear, a Mexican orange blossom materialises on her shambling Victorian terrace and someone prowls upstairs at night.

Summer - Roger Brown will create a musical evening for performance in the Casa de Cultura, celebrating the music of Andrew Lloyd Webber. Further details later in this newsletter.

Autumn - Oct 5th - 10th Love Letters by A.R.Gurney in the Studio Directed by Cherry Cabban.

There will be a further Studio production in early December, several plays are under consideration



# **Amateur Sleuths in a Spiffing Spoof!**

**Look Out - He's Got A Gun!** was inspired by the gung-ho, stiff upper lip style of the popular Paul Temple BBC radio serials of the 1940s and '50s. Many of these have been lost to posterity (taped over to save money - the fools) but those that remain are broadcast regularly on BBC Radio 4 Extra.

In these adventures, a writer of crime novels and amateur sleuth, and his sophisticated wife were often called in when Scotland Yard were baffled by a case. The adventures were written in cliff-hanger serial form and the plots (and number of characters) were sometimes difficult to follow and were



surprisingly formulaic with the same dangers being recycled.

The main characters were very well-mannered and keen on cocktail parties and swish nightclubs. They spoke with precise, upper crust accents and the cast was clearly divided along class lines. Anyone from Scotland Yard was very well spoken, likewise the chief villain. The lower orders (whether villains or ordinary folk) were all very cockney or vaguely "northern". Foreigners were always suspect, even Americans - a leftover from the war when the Yanks were stationed in the UK.

### Summer show 2020


I have been asked by the Play Planning Committee to devise a musical offering for next year's summer dinner show and I have decided to celebrate the work of Andrew Lloyd Webber. Accompanied by a small live combo led by Roger Parham, set very simply and dressed formally, the show will feature performances of some of Lloyd Webber's most iconic songs and, with 13 musicals to choose from, there is no shortage of them. There will be a narrative linking songs together with interesting information about the music and the shows it came from. This may be delivered by a narrator or by several narrators. There is no intention of putting much, if any, dance but there may be a little movement, it is after all not a choral concert!

I want to create the show around those of you who would like to take part rather than choose the music and then try to cast it, so get your thinking caps on and shower me with suggestions of songs that you would like to sing. Don't forget that we can, within limits, change keys of songs to fit the vocal range of the singer(s).

Just one note of caution. Space at the Casa de Cultura is limited, as is time to rehearse, so there will be very limited songs for a

'chorus' and the bulk of the 18 or 20 songs will be solos, duets or maybe trios. Everyone taking part will be expected to form the chorus and will be expected to learn the music, lyrics and harmonies from teaching tracks and possibly backing tracks away from rehearsals.

Roger Parham and I will hold a get together, probably in **October** when he returns to Spain, at which we will outline our thoughts in more detail and try to gauge the level of interest and ability of those of you that want to take part. So keep an eye out for more information and don't hesitate to contact me with questions, suggestions or expressions of interest between now and then. Roger
